

Liga Portugal considers it essential to implement an Anti-Corruption Management System, in accordance with the reference standard NP ISO 37001:2018 in order to guarantee the transparency of the organisation.

In order to achieve the recommended objectives we propose to abide by the following guidelines:

- Prohibit the practice of active or passive corruption activities;
- Ensure compliance with anti-corruption laws and regulations, applicable in Portugal or countries that relate to Liga Portugal's activity, as well as with national and international sports documents and regulations;
- Request the participation of all internal or external stakeholders in the identification of less transparent practices or procedures that may raise suspicions of corruption or bribery, ensuring that such practice will not be subject to any reprisal.
- Comply with the requirements of the anti-corruption management system and promote its continuous improvement;
- Analyse suspicious practices that are less appropriate than those defined in the Anti-corruption Management System (SGAC) or the Transparency Code, through an independent commission, the Transparency Commission.
- Identify and assess corruption risks in accordance with established criteria, implementing mitigating measures for risks deemed unacceptable.
- Promote awareness on the fight against corruption among all employees of the organisation.

Non-compliance with what is established in the Anti-corruption Management System documents may lead to disciplinary or criminal proceedings, depending on the gravity and specificity of the case.

Liga Portugal expects from all employees and partners ethical behaviour and exemplary conduct that defends the credibility and excellence of Portuguese professional football.
